

(Trieste Research Institute on Ethics, Science and Theology in Ecumenical context), the Laboratory of Science and Faith of the Diocese of Trieste, in collaboration with the Theological Faculty of Triveneto and the Italian Theological Association, is organizing an international theological conference on the dialogue between faith and science.

This event is open to theologians and scientists who are interested in the subject, and professors and doctoral candidates in theology and in the sciences. The nature of the conference is interdisciplinary, ecumenical and international. Simultaneous translation will be provided.

The event will be held on-site depending on the current epidemiological situation. It will be possible to follow along remotely.

THEOLOGY AND SCIENCE: CONDITIONS FOR DIALOGUE

The first day will be dedicated to looking at the relationship between theological reflection and the sciences, focusing on the journey that has been made so far. After the opening greetings, the first session will touch on the historical aspect and then open the floor to a scientist and an internationally renowned theologian. The day ends with a reflection on artificial intelligence.

2nd DAY - September 16

A THEOLOGICAL AND SCIENTIFIC LOOK AT THE PANDEMIC

The second day is fully dedicated to a real case study of dialogue between theology and science: the pandemic and its concrete impact on each and every person's life. It will start off with an introduction of a much more existential and philosophical nature offered by an intellectual who experienced COVID-19. The second contribution will come from the field of science, beginning with how science and its messaging experienced this global event and then with hearing from a statistician and a sociologist and their interpretation of the data, looking at the pandemic's impact on society. After this analysis, a philosopher and a theologian will explore what the data says (experiential, statistical, sociological, scientific) in their reflections so as to tap into how they are expressed in such categories as freedom, determinism, causality and chance, theodicy.

THEOLOGY AND SCIENCE: WHICH EDUCATIONAL PATHWAYS?

The third day of the conference begins with asking whether the current situation as defined by scientific thought has had an impact on the different ways of doing theology and in particular on the theological anthropology debate. It begins, therefore, with thinking about the human person and the post-human in order to gather ideas for some workshops that the research institute, T.R.I.E.S.T.E.c., is sponsoring over the next year 2021-2022. It will also mark the start of a path of research on the educational-didactical side of theology that is very often taught in the context of adult formation, adults being the majority of those who approach the world of theology.
